



<u>Curriculum Overview for Design Technology</u> <u>Year 9</u>

Term 1: Textiles Cushion Substantive Knowledge:

To demonstrate an understanding of the formal elements

To develop knowledge around the culture and history of the Mexican tradition Day of the Dead.

To develop textile skills, techniques and processes such as applique, hand embroidery, fabric painting and appropriate finishes. To develop historical and contemporary understanding of artist research To create an outcome that meets the design brief and specification using ACCESS FM To complete market research to support future designs.

To develop an understanding of the making of cotton.

To develop an understanding of the health and safety risks and hazards when working with specialised equipment.
